# INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATIONS TECHNOLOGY STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT 2016

#### Conditions of Use - Students

At St Brigid's the use of computers, the Internet and email is a privilege, not a right. In light of this the students at St Brigid's will be required to adhere to the following guidelines with regard to the use of computers, the Internet and email:

- the Internet will be used only for classroom work or other set educational work
- students will not deliberately create, access, display, download or send unacceptable material (racist, sexist, violent, obscene, threatening, disrespectful, rude, slanderous or harassing) on any school computer
- students accidentally accessing unacceptable material must immediately turn off the screen and notify the supervising teacher
- students will not physically damage hardware or software or interfere with system configurations or files
- students will not knowingly breach copyright laws or plagiarise material obtained from the Internet
- students will not use another person's account (ie email address or login name)
- students will not divulge confidential details about themselves (eg telephone number, address) in any email they send or Internet site they access first names only are to be used
- students will be aware that any material accessed or saved will be subject to review by teachers.
- each student will have email access and their own individual account. Years P-4 may only access their email while under a teacher's direct instruction
- portable media devices (such as memory sticks) are not allowed at school

## Cyber bullying will not be tolerated at any level and consequences exist for students who choose to bully others.

#### Netalert defines cyber bullying as:

"Bullying that is carried out through an internet service, such as email, chat room, discussion group or instant messaging. It can also include bullying through mobile phone technologies such as short messaging service (SMS). Examples of cyber bullying include teasing, spreading rumours online, sending unwanted messages, or defamation."
